Whilst we might be geographically remote, our Council ambition is reflected in how we are investing in our infrastructure and Cornwall has never been more connected, with the construction of the £50m mid-Cornwall metro, a growing airport, and multi-million pound investment in Cornwall's strategic roads. We are also connected digitally and seriously innovative in this space – Cornwall played a pivotal role in the development of transatlantic communication – and we continue to innovate in terms of digital and green energy.

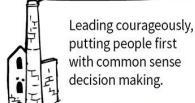
